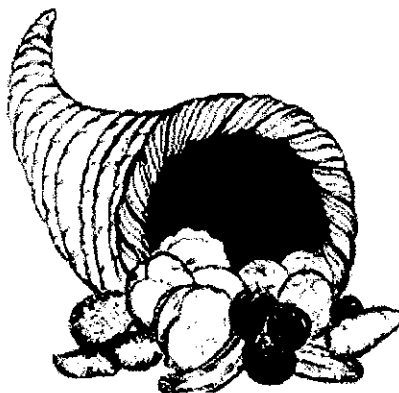

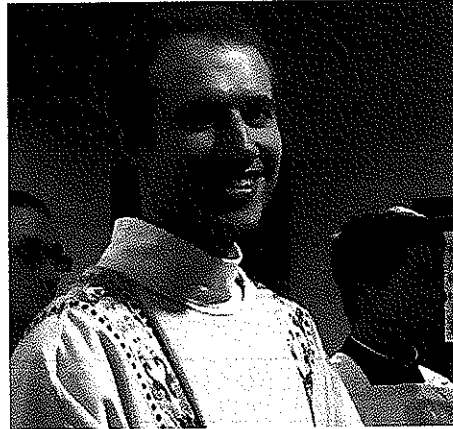
Youth

SEMINARIAN EDUCATION FUND



The Diocese of Birmingham in Alabama currently has eight men studying for the priesthood. This is both a blessing from God and a sign of a maturing diocese. 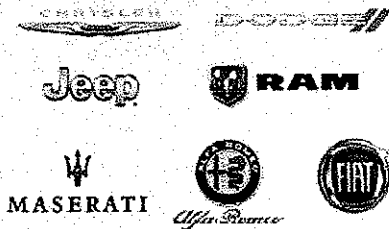
