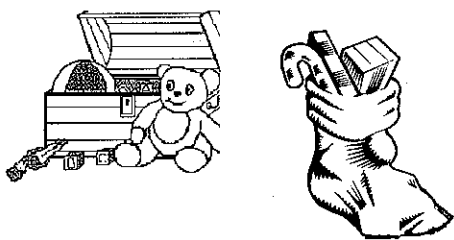

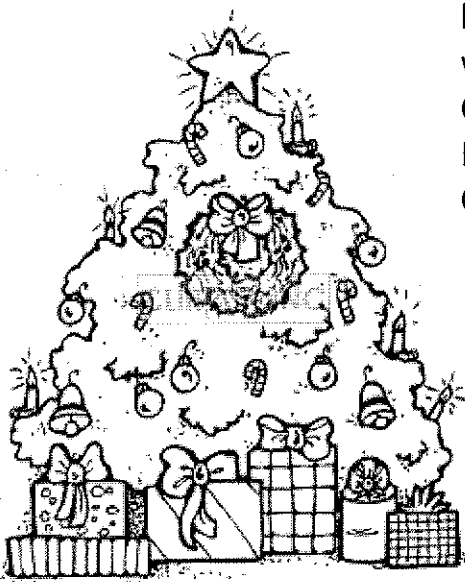

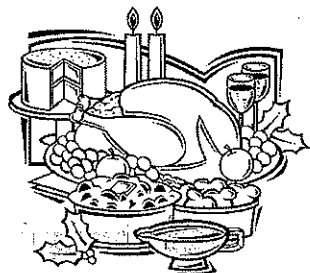

PEACE in the STORM

Finnigan Spencer's a Clinton supporter. Justin Pyle, who lives just across the street from Spencer in Gardendale, is a Trump guy through and through.

Oh, and there's more to them than that. Spencer's also a 50-year-old veteran, a new grandfather and an avid spelunker. He loves his family and his dog and cats. And he loves America.

And Pyle's a machinist who used to work on equipment in coal mines. He's father to a 7-year-old son and 8-month-old twins named Raven and Ava. He loves his family too. And America.

And on the night when the country held its breath, when families were split and states branded with the label of red or blue, Pyle walked across Alma Avenue to the home Spencer shares with partner, Leigh Dudrow.

He sat down to watch election results on the big flat box Spencer calls "the altar in the living room telling us what to do." It was tuned to MSNBC, but the Republican did not even mind.

Because on this night, after this fight, these people were still convinced they have more in common than in dispute. Pyle is the guy who takes Spencer to the auto parts store if he needs to work on his car. Spencer's the man who helped Pyle get ready to move the new twins in.

"We're from the same community, the same country, the same demographic," Spencer said.

"We just have different opinions."

"No matter who wins or loses, he's still a good person," Pyle said.

It is a mind-blowing, brain-melting display of ... reason. It's a tonic in a country suffering the heartburn of election indigestion.

It's not that they agree on issues. Pyle worries about the economy and wants to build up the military that is, as he puts it, "the lowest it's been." Spencer speaks of hungry children who could be fed with money that will be used instead to fuel inevitable war in the Middle East.

But they move beyond it. They agree to disagree. They rec-

ognize the humanity in one another despite internet and social media that too often tell them to focus on differences.

They recognized it a few weeks ago and posed for a quick picture shaking hands over the Trump sign in Pyle's yard. Spencer posted it on his Facebook page with these words:

"Meet my neighbor, he and I are able to cross party lines and agree on LOVE is the answer not politics. We have agreed that no matter who wins, we will respect and love each other, as Americans like we did before this presidential race. As fathers and as men we both know, it's really up to us to work together, to make this a better world for our children."

Response was overwhelmingly positive.

For a while, it provided a respite in a storm of anger and hate. And both Pyle and Spencer bought in.

They know as they don't have to agree in order to be friends, or neighbors, or countrymen. But because they love and support their families and their communities, they feel a duty to be reasonable.

"No matter who wins we support America," Spencer said. "Our parents and grandparents are the same people who elected presidents they didn't always support. We're not going to play the victim tomorrow because our candidate didn't win."

"He's still the same man he was last week," Pyle said.

He is. He's the guy who still has a gift for summing things up.

"At the end of the day we're both voting for Americans," Spencer said.

"They may be (jerks), but they are Americans."

Couldn't have said it better myself.

Dear Parishioners,

Our long election is finally over. Let's pray for those elected to public office who will serve our country and community. We pray for "the elect" because we understand the tremendous responsibilities entrusted to those who govern and the power and potential that office has for change. Let's pray we be better citizens willing to join hands and hearts seeking solutions to problems that confront the common good.

In every election after the voters have spoken, there are those with the feel of victory and those with the feel of defeat. It is appropriate to remember at the end of this election cycle, whether we're feeling victorious or depressed, our identity as Christians is never linked to a particular political party. Instead we draw our identity from the God who is Father of all, who reveals His unconditional love through Jesus Christ and who empowers with grace and energy our lives and vocations through the Holy Spirit. This is my identity and it has remained steady and constant throughout a very long election year. It is your identity and in faith we are assured it remains unchanged as we move on the way.

During the election season our scripture readings at Mass have reminded us again and again of our true identity and how it defines our right relationship with God and one another. The lessons given by scripture, and this election particularly, are simple. We remain sister and brother regardless of any difference of opinion. Our character and actions are important and offer the clearest evidence that our relationships with God and others are authentic and right. In other words, the Golden Rule remains relative. In relationships two wrongs do not make a right and the end never justifies the means.

There is a dishonest expression among some Christians "the devil made me do it." Some during the long election season blamed or justified their actions or inactions upon the demeanor of the candidates, something posted on social media, or simply the need to be right and in control. I'm the first to admit life and vocation can at times be frustrating especially when I feel powerless amidst an ever changing world. The good news to take home is that you and I are never powerless in righting broken relationships, examining conscious, coming home to our better selves and our true identity. We believe in a living and loving God that we encounter on the way, and so there remains a future of hope.

And so, dear friends, our long election has finally ended. In the end, I wonder will it help to make our country and community a better place...yes we pray and yes we pledge. More importantly, I wonder will it help to make you and me better persons, sisters and brothers, true to our identity...yes I pray and yes I pledge. Will you join me in making this pledge?

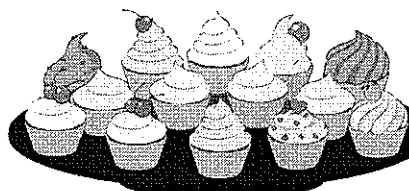

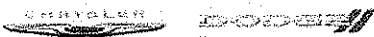

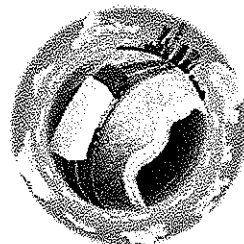
